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EMA publishes positive opinion on a fixed-dose combination of albendazole and ivermectin to treat parasitic worm infections



The Committee for Medicinal Products for Human Use of the European Medicines Agency (EMA) has issued a <u>positive scientific opinion</u> on the fixed-dose combination of albendazole and ivermectin for the treatment of infections caused by soil-transmitted helminths and lymphatic filariasis in adults, adolescents, and children aged 5 years or older. The favourable assessment by the EMA, based on the results of the ALIVE trial led by the <u>STOP Consortium</u>, represents a significant milestone for this pharmacological tool, advancing its potential for widespread adoption in endemic countries.

The journey toward this achievement began in 2017 when the <u>Mundo Sano Foundation</u> <u>partnered with EDCTP</u> to leverage research funding aimed at combating neglected infectious diseases. This partnership provided resources for the STOP 1 and 2 projects, highlighting the importance of collaborations to address these critical health challenges.

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Global Health EDCTP3 call for proposals



On 30 January 2025, Global Health EDCTP3 launched its <u>calls for proposals for 2025</u>. The calls are part of the <u>2025 Work Programme</u>, which is the largest and most ambitious since

the Joint Undertaking was established, featuring a total budget of €214 million. Four calls for proposals have been announced, addressing the following topics:

- Accelerating the development of prophylactic vaccines against Neglected Tropical Diseases (NTDs) in sub-Saharan Africa
- Global collaboration action for research on existing Malaria therapeutics and clinical development of new antimalarial candidates
- Global collaboration action for the development of vaccines for reducing the disease burden of Tuberculosis in sub-Saharan Africa
- Global collaborative action for strengthening the Regional Networks of Excellence and Epidemic Preparedness Consortia
- Global collaborative action tackling Diarrhoeal Diseases in the context of Climate and Health
- Global Health EDCTP3 JU and contributing partners funded Strategic Training Hubs for Fellowships in Public Health covering Biostatistics, Epidemiology and Modelling
- Transformative Innovations in Global Health

The deadline for the calls for proposals is **20 March 2025**.

Twelfth EDCTP Forum updates



Preparations for the Twelfth EDCTP Forum are moving at full speed. The submission period for abstracts and scientific symposia closed on 23 February 2025, and the Programme Committee has now begun the evaluation process. Applicants can expect to receive the results by early April.

Registration to attend the EDCTP Forum is now open. Please note that attendance is limited to in-person participation and is free of charge. However, all attendees are responsible for organising their own travel, accommodation, visa, and insurance arrangements, as well as covering the associated costs, except for invited delegates sponsored by Global Health EDCTP3 and scholarship recipients.

Abstract authors (including scholarship candidates) and chairs or speakers of scientific symposia should **wait until after the abstract and symposium review is complete before registering for the Forum**. Once this evaluation process concludes, those selected for abstracts and scientific symposia will receive additional registration instructions.

Africa CDC and Global Health EDCTP3 sign Memorandum of Understanding



The Africa Centres for Disease Control and Prevention (Africa CDC) and Global Health EDCTP3 have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to support their shared objective of promoting public health in Africa and enhancing their collaboration in strengthening health research, clinical trials, and pandemic preparedness across the African continent.

This MoU builds on a well-established partnership formed through previous EDCTP programmes and follows a <u>previous MoU concluded between the EDCTP Association and Africa CDC in 2021</u>. It comes at a time of increasing global health challenges, including climate change, ongoing conflicts, and constrained financial resources for public health. Through the MoU, the Africa CDC and Global Health EDCTP3 express their commitment to joining efforts and maintaining a close and continuous relationship to achieve their common objectives.

Recent events

Launch of the 100 Days Mission Fourth Implementation report



On 31 January 2025, Cape Town, South Africa, served as the backdrop for a significant hybrid event marking the launch of the 100 Days Mission Fourth Implementation report. This initiative, led by the International Pandemic Preparedness Secretariat (IPPS) in collaboration with the South African Government and the South African Medical Research Council (SAMRC), underscores key advancements in pandemic preparedness and response efforts.

The event marked the official launch of the 4th Implementation Report alongside the 2nd 100 Days Mission Scorecard, emphasising key findings and priorities for the year ahead. Significant discussions focused on the role of African leadership in enhancing pandemic preparedness and strengthening global health security.

Notably, the event also included two interactive workshops focused on pressing issues such as research and development (R&D) ecosystems vital for pandemic preparedness and the integration of artificial intelligence (AI) into biosecurity strategies.

Dr Thomas Nyirenda, Strategic Partnerships and Capacity Development Manager and Head of Africa Office of the EDCTP Association, represented the organisation at this pivotal event. The focus on epidemic and pandemic preparedness is essential, forming a core aspect of the Global Health EDCTP3 Strategic Research and Innovation Agenda.

Key content from the report includes progress on the 100 Days Mission, upcoming challenges and opportunities for medical countermeasure development, priority action areas for 2025, an assessment of readiness and funding through the 100 Days Mission Scorecard 2.0, and a case study analysing the current response to mpox within this framework.

EDCTP2 project news

SAVING Consortium event on introducing new healthcare tools in Ghana



The **SAVING Consortium** held a hybrid event on 27 February 2025 under the theme "The Challenge of Introducing New Health Care Tools." The event focused on the project's experience in building institutional and individual capacity in implementation research through South-South and North-South collaboration. It also presented experiences in enhancing evidence-based decision-making for the effective uptake and delivery of new medical interventions and examined the role of North-South collaboration in the uptake of new medical interventions through implementation research and the facilitation of mutual learning and knowledge management.

Invited speakers included experts from Ghana's Ministry of Health, the Ghana Food and Drugs Authority, Swiss TPH, and other key partner institutions.

New clinical trial investigates safety and immune response of Invaplex AR-Detox Shigella vaccine



A newly published article outlines the protocol for new phase Ia/b clinical trial for the Invaplex_{AR-Detox} Shigella vaccine coadministered with the dmLT adjuvant in The Netherlands and Zambia, marking an important step in Shigella vaccine development.

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UNIVERSAL 1 trial enrols first patients



An important milestone has been reached in the fight against paediatric HIV with the enrolment of the first participants in the <u>UNIVERSAL 1</u> trial. UNIVERSAL 1 will investigate whether a fixed-dose combination of dolutegravir, emtricitabine, and tenofovir alafenamide, a highly effective and well-tolerated regimen for adults, is as safe and effective for children aged between 28 days and 10 years of age.

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Strengthening epidemiology training in French-speaking Africa: insights from the PREP-EPID project



The PREP-EPID project aims to develop a consortium of institutions that bring together diverse experiences and expertise to bolster the training of professionals in epidemiology and biostatistics across French-speaking African countries. The project is part of the EDCTP and the Africa CDC initiative to support consortia providing Master's-level training in these critical fields. To date, numerous activities have been executed to disseminate the project's achievements among key stakeholders.

Professor Orrell is an EDCTP Fellow and a distinguished HIV Clinician and Clinical Pharmacologist. Since 2002, she has been conducting innovative HIV research at the Desmond Tutu HIV Centre and the University of Cape Town, serving as the Lead and Principal Investigator on various studies focusing on efficacy, toxicity, interactions, and dosing.
